PAMAfrica: A portfolio approach to developing next-generation malaria treatments for Africa

Supporting a portfolio of three clinical studies, the PAMAfrica Consortium aims to contribute to malaria elimination by developing new antimalarial medicines for the most at-risk populations, including newborns, patients with severe malaria and those with drug resistant infections. PAMAfrica also contributes to building clinical capacity and training scientists across Africa. The consortium, supported by EDCTP and led by MMV, comprises ten public- and private-sector research and development partners across Africa and Europe.























Introduction and objective

The 3rd PAMAfrica abridged annual meeting took place at the margins of the 11th EDCTP Forum in Paris, France on the morning of 7 November. As the EDCTP Forum started on 7 November in the afternoon and several other consortia were also organizing annual meetings, it had been agreed to hold an abridged meeting focusing on Work Package progress, status and outlook with a deeper dive into capacity building, focused on the PhD and MSc students.

The time and venue of the meeting were decided by the PAMAfrica PSMC in April, in consultation with EDCTP. A placeholder invitation was sent to all PAMAfrica stakeholders in June 2023. The PAMAfrica Grant Management Team (GMT) prepared the agenda, which was shared with the PSMC for review and approval before being shared with all participants and EDCTP as observer. MMV's Travel & Events team provided support with travel and accommodation for the participants.

A total of 42 participants attended the meeting, including 11 PhD and MSc students. Three participants could not attend the meeting because they did not obtain visas in time and therefore joined virtually. Due to multiple priorities and meetings, EDCTP was not able to attend the meeting as an observer.

This report is a documentation of the meeting and will be shared with all participants and posted on the website (pamafrica-consortium.org). Participants have received the presentations made at the meeting.

Presentations

The meeting was opened by Tim Wells, the PAMAfrica Coordinator who welcomed the participants and set the scene for PAMAfrica. The moderator of the meeting Wiweka Kaszubska then guided the participants through the agenda and provided closing comments, congratulating the partners on the progress made and remarking on the valuable contributions we collectively are making to the malaria elimination agenda.

The remainder of the meeting was dedicated to PAMAfrica's five Work Packages, with speakers providing updates on progress with an outlook to the final phase of the PAMAfrica grant.

- Work Package 1: New combination treatments for uncomplicated malaria case management
- Work Package 2: First malaria treatment for vulnerable infants and neonates less than 5kg (a new AL formulation)
- Work Package 3: New non-artemisinin treatment for severe malaria (parenteral KAE609)
- Work Package 4: Building research capacity of next-generation African scientists
- Work Package 5: Operations and implementation

Building research capacity of next-generation African scientists

As mentioned above, and building on the collaboration with the SINDOFO consortium, the PhD and MSc students were invited to attend the meeting, which also provided an opportunity for networking and learning at the subsequent EDCTP Forum.

The focus on the students consisted of two parts; the first was three students presenting their thesis topics and research: , Alberto Chaque, CISM, Fabrice Mougeni, CERMEL and Emma Malinga, CERMEL.







The second part was a panel discussion facilitated by Helen Demarest, Co-Lead of Work Package 4, Capacity Building, with the 11 students present at the meeting, in person and online. PhD students: Victor Asua IDRC,

The discussion gave students the

opportunity to share their career and research aspirations and talk about some of the challenges they have faced in their academic careers, both before being selected to be part of the PAMAfrica scholarship, and in the context of pursuing their current studies in foreign countries and in a non-native language. Their stories, and the passion with which they told them, highlighted the fact that capacity building and supporting the next generation of African scientists is a multifaceted and complex topic. The MSc students shared that in Sub-Saharan Africa there is a shortage of statistical capacity to analyze the vast amount of research and routinely collected patient data. Biostatisticians are required by many types of institutions. It is therefore important to build a critical mass of specialists to enrich local research expertise and enable job opportunities and career pathways for the graduates. The PhD students highlighted the importance of the link with their home institutions and development of expertise on site to which they would be proud to contribute by mentoring their peers.

Given this feedback and the subsequent conversations during the networking event with the students and senior PAMAfrica scientists, the consortium recognized the importance of follow-up and support to students beyond the degree, connecting the dots and fostering local expertise hubs.

Facts and figures

Of the 42 people attending the meeting (three virtual), including the PhD and MSc students, there were 24 men and 18 women of which 19 represented African partners and 23 represented European partners.



Getting there (Public Transportation)


The hotel is located opposite the Paris Convention Centre at Porte Maillot.
